DISCUSSION AND COMMENTS:

- Item #1            Representatives from Walgreens, Hoytt & Lyngaas, were present to address and respond to the Committee's questions. During subsequent discussion the Committee was advised that prior to 2000 Walgreens had a full liquor department. The proposed plan is for limited beer and wine sales which would represent less than 2% of sales space. Standard business practices will be implemented to prevent the sale of alcohol during restricted hours and to under age customers. Also, the alcohol will be centralized in order to better implement these practices. Subsequent to further discussion, Wagner signed the report and Pezza deferred for further consideration. Wagner advised that he had spoken to Nybo who will phone in his signature in agreement with the report.
- Item #2            La Spisa was present to address and respond to the Committee's questions. During discussion Chiefs Neubauer and Kopp identified a number of concerns regarding the proposed event. Subsequent to this discussion the Committee directed staff to work with La Spisa and the St. Patrick's Day Parade Committee on those concerns.
- Item #3            Paschen was present to address and respond to the Committee's questions regarding an exploratory discussion on the concept of "Pedi-Cabs" (Bike taxi) for Elmhurst. Subsequent to discussion the Committee felt the concept had some merit and directed Paschen to work with the Police Department on safety regulations for a "Pedi-Cab", to further research the concept in order to develop a more defined business plan and report back to the Committee in four weeks.
- Item #4            Chief Kopp addressed and responded to the Committee's questions. Subsequent to discussion the Committee signed the report.
- Item #5            Chief Kopp addressed and responded to the Committee's questions. Subsequent to discussion the Committee signed the report.
